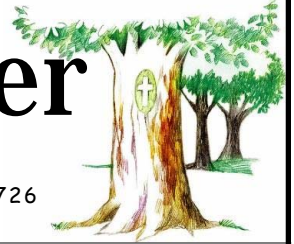

The book tables were busy as women purchased resources to take home as gifts or for personal growth. Many were able to meet and chat with Elizabeth as she signed books.

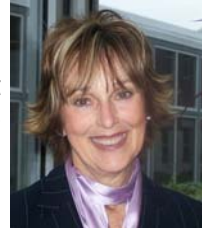
After settling back in the auditorium they were again impacted by the worship time and further

Ten women indicated they had trusted Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. The Lord and His Word were honored. Thank you to all who had a part in the day. May the Lord bless you richly.



## VBS Offering Update

The offering collected at VBS was to be used to buy things missionary children living in a foreign country can not get where they live and they miss — a taste of "home". During VBS, the children collected \$711.88! The care package was sent to the five D'Arcy sisters - Hannah, Rachel, Nicole, Megan, and Lianne - living in Papua New Guinea. The girls range in age from 9-17 years old. Each day at VBS the children learned something about the D'Arcy sister's lives during the Missionary Story time. Their parents are dorm parents in the center called Lapilo and the family also has five other children in their home. The girls asked for "real" bacon and milk—laughing as they knew we couldn't send it to them. They asked for American candy and chips. The girls were happily surprised to find real bacon in the care package (a bag for each girl) that came pre-packaged from our local grocery store's salad section. Ranch dressing mix and macaroni and cheese were also included in the package. There are only second hand stores to shop for clothing where the girls live, so we found them clothing for sports, socks, and some really fun American jewelry. To

fulfill the candy request, we sent Pringles, Skittles, M&Ms, Junior Mints, and bubble tape gum. Everything was put in Ziplock bags, as those are hard to get overseas as well. We actually sent two boxes as it would have been a very large box and more expensive to send. The care packages cost \$250.00 to buy and \$140.00 to ship. As you can see, it is very expensive to send items to missionaries living so far away, so that is why they rarely get to enjoy things from here that they might miss while they are serving God on their mission field assignment.

The remainder of the money was used to purchase some building materials needed for the cabin building project at New Tribes Recruitment Center in Jersey Shore that people from our church built on the last weekend of July. See pictures on page 6.

Thank you to the children of VBS for giving to this offering. A very big thank you to Rachael Monte, who was the teacher of the missionary story at VBS, and who did all the work to contact the D'Arcy family, asking for the girls' wish lists, buying, wrapping, and mailing the care packages. Half way around the world there are some very happy girls who got a little reminder of "home".

**Pastor Ted's Message**



A woman was in the habit of praying while ironing. One day she was thinking about the different kinds of lines — bus lines, clothes lines, fishing lines, telephone lines. Why not a prayer line? So she strung a rope with names of people she knew needed prayer. As she irons, she prays for each person by name. Not surprisingly, she gets regular requests to “hang me on your prayer line”.

Prayer is a conversation with God. It doesn't matter where you are or what you are doing, you can meet with Him and pour out your heart in prayer. Are you continually talking to God? You can praise Him as you walk in the morning, or as you rest in the evening. You can bring requests to Him or thank Him as you drive, or take a work break, or as you mow the lawn. Make praise a habit; make talking with God the practice of the day. Rest in and enjoy God, taking Him into every sphere so the fullness of the moment can be experienced. Give yourself to Him in prayer; it is His gift to us. Prayer brings God's power to our situations and delight to us. Prayer is a declaration of our dependency on God and it is an expression of our love to God. When we grasp that communing with God is the object of prayer, then we naturally fulfilled the command to pray without ceasing.

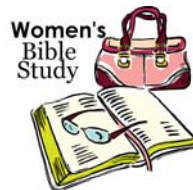

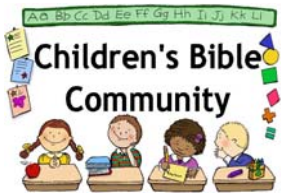

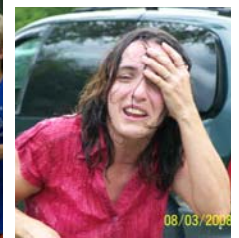

# David Takes On Goliath: The Believer & the Internet— Pt. 1

According to statistics compiled by A.C. Nielson, by November of 2007 there were 218,302,574 (71.9%) Americans who had access to the World Wide Web. But how many of us are really familiar with what's out there in cyberspace? We see news reports about an "internet predator" who has been caught stalking a young girl and right away distance ourselves from this giant who has crept into our families.

If we take an approach that David did when he confidently said he would approach Goliath in a battle; we can not only be victorious, but see how God can touch lives in ways that would be awkward or difficult in a face-to-face situation.

Understandably, many of us work with computers on the job so much that we don't want to look at one when we get home. Some also feel that the computer is such an impersonal method of communicating. But if you consider the statistics, this is the growing trend of interacting.

Just as it takes effort to greet that visitor in church on Sunday, or write a card to mail to a sick friend, it also takes effort to use the Net to connect to someone. In this series, we'll see how God can use you (and your computer) as a catalyst in making, or even strengthening, connections we have with each other and with those we've never met.

To start, let me tell you of a true story that I encountered. I have accounts on a few popular social networking sites such as MySpace. I use it to promote what I do on the radio and simply to meet folks. I came across a teenager on MySpace who had commented on the profile of a local Christian rock band. When I viewed his profile, I saw he had written several blogs. As I read through them, I realized this boy had a lot of struggles in life. You see, you'll find that on the Net, folks may reveal more of themselves than they would if you were talking to them in person. As I read more of his blogs, I saw this guy was hurting inside so much that he was threatening harm to himself. I was compelled to connect with him and ask how I could pray for him. Wisely, he was cautious at first, but as we exchanged messages over several months, we got to know each other and met in person. God was able to use me to help meet a need in his life. Now this same boy, went on to get his Eagle Scout award and enroll at Lock Haven University. He was also a guest of mine at a recent Big Woods worship service.

I have seen how God has placed people in my life through the Internet and this has provided me with various opportunities to share my faith, encourage others, and even invite folks to a LIFE group or to



church. Since the majority of us feel there is some security in typing something on a keyboard instead of talking face-to-face or on the phone, I have found folks willing to reveal how they feel readily online.

Facebook, which is the more "grown-up" looking social network, allows users to indicate their "status" - a feature that MySpace has just recently added. This gives an opportunity for me to respond in kind. For example, let's say the status of my friend reads, "Mike is trying to put it all together." I am able to send Mike a message asking if I can help find what he needs to put things back together. By responding to his "status" to begin a dialogue, I'm able to connect with him to let him know I am interested about his situation. This may open up opportunities for ministry where God can use me in Mike's life.

Recently, a social community for churches has been developed. MyChurch.org offers many of the same features the other social networks do. Big Woods has a profile at MyChurch.org/BigWoods or you can see it directly from our church's website. Users register and set up a profile and then pick a church to "join."

It is a desire of mine to see our church body utilize the Internet for a Kingdom purpose. At [www.bigwoods.org](http://www.bigwoods.org), we have a footprint on the Web that can be used to usher in visitors who may be looking for answers. Our church website is also a place to find timely articles that can be read or to communicate information about needs or events within the church, and so much more.

Eventually, sermon audio (or "podcasts"), prayer lists and church newsletters can be made available for registered website members to download from our website. We could eventually offer electronic versions of gospel tracts or a church brochure which can be made available for website visitors to download and print from our website too.

Obviously, I have only scratched the surface when it comes to the width and depth of ministry opportunities we as believers can explore with sharing Jesus online. The first thing that needs to be done before anything else is our need to overcome Goliath's intimidation. The Internet is intimidating only if you allow it to be. I hope to encourage you to take some effort sometime and plunge into the cyber-world. It's something you can take as much time as you want to broaden your connection with others. Meeting someone online need not have a negative connotation. And I believe, we as a church, can proactively work to change that perspective.

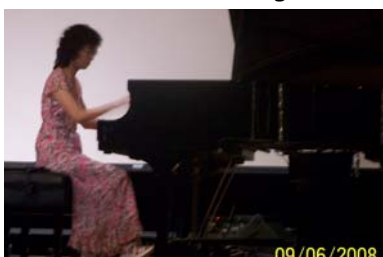

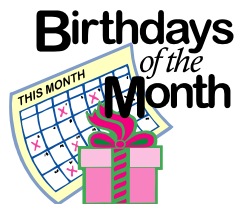
